### Area to receive genetic disease aid

Financial aid to help combat genetic diseases has been assured for the Buffalo area through a statewide grant awarded under terms of the newly adopted National Genetic Diseases Act.

The funding for this area, estimated at about \$25,000, will be channeled through the Division of Medical Genetics at the State University at Buffalo to expand service activities.

The Genetic Diseases Act was recently adopted by Congress to provide support for screening. diagnosis and treatment of genetic diseases and counseling services.

The federal funds appropriated were offered on a statewide basis. New York State's application, in competition with other states, was drawn up by geneticists from throughout the state. The statewide grant amounts to more than \$300,000 for the first year's activities.

One of the problems encountered in setting up the state campus for special statewise

proposal was the coordination of diagnostic services relaed to the needs of the New York City area, well supplied with relatively sophisticated genetic centers, and Upstate New York, where population is more thinly spread and where genetic services are confined mainly to the larger cities. Cooperation was achieved through a statewide advisory council, which included consumer representatives.

Two of the members of the executive committee which formulated the state proposal are UB geneticists Dr. Robert Guthrie and Dr. Robin M. Bannerman.

Dr. Guthrie devised the Guthrie test for the early detection of phenylketonuria, or PKU, in the newborn. The test, now in use world-wide, has led to the effective treatment of children who might otherwise have become mentally retarded. The new grant will provide support for Dr. Guthrie's laboratory on the Main Street

mental retardation.

Dr. Bannerman heads UB's Division of Medical Genetics, which provides clinical services at both Children's Hospital in Buffalo and Buffalo General Hospital. Dr. Bannerman observed that the additional funding would be "of great value" in expanding genetic diseases services in Western New York.

In terms of disease prevention, Dr. Bannerman added, the funding should prove highly cost-effective. His observation was related to an estimate by the U.s. Department of Health, Education and Welfare that the lifetime cost of maintaining a seriously afflicted genetic patient, assuming institutionalization, amounts to approximately \$250,000.

Many types of birth defects are caused by inherited, or genetic, diseases which are attributed to malfunctioning genes and chromosomes in body cells

# Questions

Q.Will the formerly vacant lot on Eighth Avenue, presently used by DJH Construction Co. for equipment and storage, be left vacant after all the sewer work has been done? Richard L. Lichoroblec, North Tonawanda

A. If you really want to preserve the clipping from the paper, it will take some effort. The problem with newsprint paper is the amount of acid in it, so you have to de-acidify the paper, then add alkalies with buffers. Then mount the clipping with non-acidic backing (don't use a corn starch-base glue). To really keep it, it must be put in a dark cold place, such as your freezer.

called his "gullible telepathic tranendorsement", the Kings College mathematician has reported that experiments have failed to confirm abnormal powers in faith healers, dowsers, metal benders and other psychics. Taylor's long research, published in Nature magazine, was based on the theory that only electromagnetic (EM) radiation could account for abnormal effects and if it was absent, it had to be assumed there was no extrasensory perception (ESP) taking place. In other words, alleged ESP in the absence of EM must be viewed with suspicion. For example, in one to deflect a needle suspended in a Perspex cylinder by a fine thread. There was no EM registered at the time. When an anti-static ointment was rubbed over the cylinder the effect disappeared showing it was induced from outside. Reexamination found that the subjects had inadvertently touched the cylinder creating static which induced charges on the needle and gave the appearance of psychokinesis - the movement of an object without physical contact. Since Taylor was sharply criticized by New Scientist as "the man who more than any other established the credibility of Uri Geller", his metal bending experiments were of major interest. He said he conducted 268 trials with 68 subjects under four sets of conditions. The first three involved sensitive instruments to guard against faking and no metal bending at all resulted. Tests without instruments, constituting the "more relaxed environment" requested by some of the subjects, did produce some bending but Taylor could not detect any elec-tromagnetism. Nor was there any EM present
