I'm currently the Outreach & Retention Specialist for the School of Visual & Performing Arts, which is really an expansion of the ALLC position.

How would you describe your job?

There are several different components to my job, but my main focus is forming a connection with first year students and I'm able to do that by teaching all of the sections of orientation for the SVPA. What students don't understand is that everyone struggles their first semester, but they're all so great at hiding it, they think they're the only one. What they need is someone to turn to and I see myself as a bridge. When students start out they face a number of different challenges; whether it's social, emotional, financial or academic and because I'm with them from day one, they come to me. The benefit from being here so long and working with so many different departments is that if I don't have an answer, I know who does.

What distinguishes UT from other workplaces?

Everyone I've worked with has the same goal, and that is to help students achieve their dream of graduating from the University of Toledo. From the ground up it's a team effort and there have been countless times that I've seen people go far above and beyond to make a difference in a student's life. Working with people who

Useful takeaways included

- Seek professional development, such as attending conferences or even a PSA brownbag seminar
- Be visible and engaged: get involved on-campus in committees to help make a difference and help people to know who you are (PSC elections are coming up later this spring)
- Find a mentor who is someone you aspire to be, and network with people you aspire to be
- Be optimistic: let your coworkers see you as a positive and helpful person



He once walked over 240 miles across the entire state of Ohio in 10 days to fulfill a promise. In just two years, because I said I would has sent over 3.15 million promise cards to over 153 different countries. The promises written on these cards have made headlines around the world.


All UT students who have sophomore standing (30 earned hours and a 2.5 cumulative GPA by the time of application are eligible and encouraged to apply.


